His police career began as a cadet in Loyalsock Township High School's *Senior Professional & Career Experience Program* in 1975. His dedication to his field is shown by consistent advancement and promotion over his career including a 30-year career at the Old Lycoming Police Department, the last five years serving as Chief of Police. He is currently serving his third term as Sheriff of Lycoming County.

Sheriff Lusk was instrumental in bringing various grant programs to our area including the first United States Department of Justice grant for local school district resource officers, and working with the US Marshall Service to secure equipment and support for local law enforcement.

He has been a guest lecturer for over thirty years at Loyalsock Township High School, Pennsylvania College of Technology, Lycoming College, local Lions clubs, Rotary clubs, regional fire departments, municipal governments, and many other civic groups.

Sheriff Lusk has an outstanding record of volunteering in our community. He has been a member of Old Lycoming Township Volunteer Fire Company for forty-years serving in various capacities, Lycoming County Safe Schools Committee, Little League Baseball coach and board member, and member of the Tiadaghton Valley Regional Police Commission.
